Holy Week and Easter
Greetings.

Dear Parishioners and
Friends of C & E:

For the last five weeks, we have been walking in the way of the cross with Jesus. During our Lenten journey, Jesus invites us to walk with him through the desert of our lives, the desert of our social and economic issues. Jesus invites us to reflection and penance, thus opening to us the possibility of a renewed and accomplished life through the glory of his Resurrection.

Our Lenten walk with Jesus takes us through the Holy Week that begins with Palm Sunday. The triumphant return of Jesus to Jerusalem helps us to pay a

great homage to our Lord, singing his praises, before the scandal of the cross: “Hosanna, O Son of David!” Let us acclaim the King, as he was welcomed by Mary, Joseph, the angels and the shepherds.

Nicodemus, the woman at the well, the blind beggar, Mary and Martha are all followers of Jesus who for us have been guideposts and examples of discipleship through the season of Lent. Our Lord used each of these diverse people in order to reveal God’s glory to us all. In them we see the human struggle for understanding, and yearning for a deepening of faith and unity with God.

Through those stories of Lenten disciples we are led, once again to Calvary, that despicable yet blessed place where through Jesus

Christ, true discipleship and unity with God became a reality for all.

I hope that you will be able to join us for as much of the Holy Week and Easter experience as possible. Each liturgy tells its own story - from the shouts of Hosanna! on Palm Sunday, to the tenderness of the First Eucharist on Maundy Thursday, to the shouts of “Crucify him!” on Good Friday - we walk with Jesus and those who loved him to the agony of the cross and finally, to the glory of the empty tomb.

It is my prayer that you all will be greatly blessed during this Holy Week. And I also hope that you will encounter Jesus along the way, and that the joy of Easter morning and the resurrection of our Lord

will be carried forth in your hearts both now and throughout the year 2018.

History of the Bartlett Cross

Our celebration Processional Cross comes from Church of the Epiphany (which merged with Christ Church and Saint Mark's Mission to become Christ and The Epiphany), in memory of Harry R. Bartlett who gave his life for his country, by his mother Minnie J. Bartlett in 1927. Shown here carried by Andrew Simon on Scout Sunday, March 4, 2018.

Harry Richard Bartlett (November 30, 1894 - April 27, 1918) was the first soldier from East Haven to die in World War I. The American

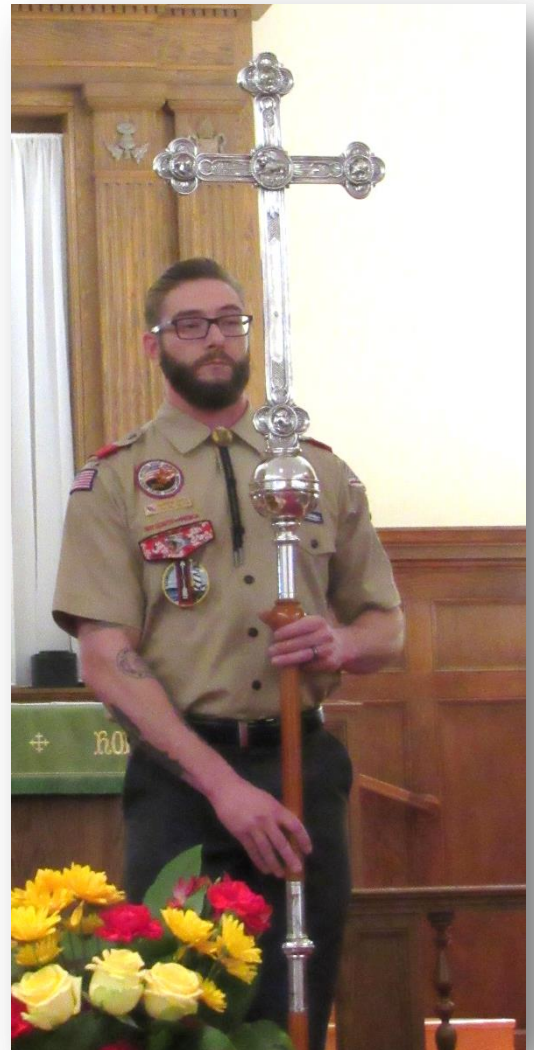
Legion post on Thompson St., East Haven is named in his honor. Bartlett was referred to as a war hero in historical records. He was one of twelve East Haven men who was deployed with the 103rd Machine Gun Battalion in October 1917. He was the only man from that group who paid the ultimate sacrifice. He was killed in Apremont, France and his remains were returned after the war. He is interred in East Lawn Cemetery on River Street, East Haven.

A monument in memory of Harry and four other East Haven soldiers who died in combat in World War I is located on the

Main Street/Hemingway Avenue corner of the East Haven Green.

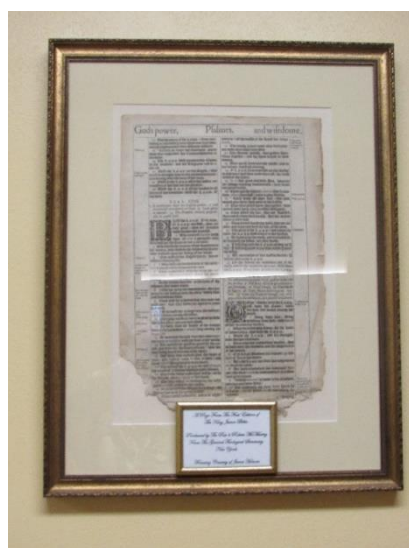
