## Backpack Program

The Backpack Program is

staffed with approximately six people and four parishioners. We've added the numbers needed to complete the assembly circle. Though the process may seem a bit hectic at the times it is also full of laughter and camaraderie.

The Backpack Program is supported by the East Haven Food Pantry. Since December 2018 donations to the food pantry have plummeted enough that it has affected the number of items that are placed in the backpack for the child's weekend supply of food. Where we typically included two juice boxes, we now include only one. We're praying that we can complete the school year without reducing any more food to these children.

During the week of March 18<sup>th</sup> East Haven schools demonstrated their support by initiating a food drive for specific items from each classroom. These items were then donated to the East Haven Food Pantry with the individual items benefiting the Backpack Program. Serving 96 children the donations will deplete quickly.

Donations of juice boxes, variety snack pack cereal, Chef Boyardee lunches, etc. are of great value. Please keep these children in mind when doing your food shopping.

## The Many Voices of Christianity - BAPTISTS

Baptist churches can be traced back to 1609 Amsterdam where pastor John Smith rejected the baptism of infants and only baptized believing adults using full immersion. In 1638 Roger Williams established the first Baptist congregation in the North American colonies. Later the US Baptist congregations split over slavery creating the "Southern Baptist Convention" and the northern "American Baptist Churches USA" (ABC-USA).

While Baptist doctrine is very similar to Episcopal doctrine, it only recognizes two sacraments - Baptism and Communion. For something to become a matter of faith and practice it must be explicitly commanded in Scripture. This is why Baptists do not practice infant baptism.

Baptists have also been strong proponents of freedom of religion for all and the separation of church and state.

Baptist congregations do not have a hierarchical structure with each church governing itself although churches can join groups or affiliations with other Baptist churches. Through the years differences have caused the emergence of many different Baptist groups with various theological creeds and religious practices including an "Episcopal Baptist" group. Some groups

are much more conservative in their beliefs while many are fully inclusive (like the American Baptists).

Baptists in the US number about 50 million and represent almost one third of American Protestants. There are five Baptist churches in New Haven including Trinity Baptist on State Street. The American Baptist Church's website is <http://www.abc-usa.org/>.
